Hawton made his move at the start of lap three when he got to the inside of Johnston into Gate corner. Hawton opened up a gap and went on to take the victory. Johnston maintained second position with Duncan taking third spot. Rose held off Ferguson until lap six when the latter took the position and took fourth. Rose came home fifth. Andrew Wisely passed Grant on lap three and held sixth position until the chequered flag. Gary Clark finished seventh, Tony Strachan eighth and Grant ninth.

### ICC Gearbox

Graham Mutch took the early lead over nephew Darren McDonald. Mutch held the lead until the halfway point when McDonald took the position and held on to take the chequered flag. Mutch took second. Rob Walker was third at the end of lap but young Darren Patrick gained the position on the second tour and held the position. ### Prokarts
