Honda Cadets

Recently crowned A plate champion, Jordan Donaldson, took an early lead opening up a ten-metre gap over Sam McKenzie, Gordon Mutch, Sandy Mitchell and Michael McPherson. After early lap changes the chasing bunch order settled down to Mitchell, Mutch, McKenzie and MacPherson. By mid-distance the pack had caught Donaldson. Mitchell grabbed the lead on lap nine at Gate Corner but Donaldson regained the lead three laps later. On the thirteenth lap through Seafield, Donaldson suddenly slowed with engine problems and retired leaving Mitchell leading. Mutch was harrying Mitchell and made his move at pit corner on the last lap when a dive down the inside, which was successful and took the chequered flag. Mitchell came home second less than two tenths down to retain the S plate for 2011. In the mean time MacPherson had taken third from McKenzie but the latter got the position back on the last lap. Abbie Munro came home fifth head of novices Reece Low and Ben Patience.

Mini Max

Liam Black, who had won all the heats, took a lights to flag victory. The contest was for second with Jack Simpson holding off James Paterson with the two crossing the line a tenth of a second apart. Next up was Chloe Scott, Neil MacLennan and Jack Gordon who finished within a second. MacLennan was staying out of trouble and took the championship. Seventh and eighth was Alex McKay and Finlay Hutchison.

Junior Max

An early incident where a number of karts were off eliminated Jack Williamson and Frazer Huntley. Kyle Fowlie charged away to take a comfortable win and claim the Super Series Championship. Keifer Steyn came home two second ahead of Brogan Kinsella. Connor Wilson held off Rory MacLennan who had claimed fifth on the last lap from Gavin Simpson.

Senior Max

Bruce Buchan got the best start from the outside of the front row followed by Ryan Tod and Andrew Harvie. Tod squeezed through to lead at Kevin's Korner and Harvie at pit corner. Harvie was charging hard to maintain his record of winning all Super Series finals but had to settle for second on this occasion. Tod took the chequered flag and the championship. Bruce Buchan was holding third from David Kellock. Logan Watt took fourth from Kellock and then Bruce Buchan two laps from the finish to claim third. Bruce Buchan finished fourth ahead of Kellock, Kris Manett, Andrew Buchan, Steven Dailly, Tony Strachan and Luke Geddes. Seven seconds covered the first ten over the line.

ICC (Gearbox)

Graham Clark lead the gearbox final away knowing that a finish would make him Super Series Champion. Alistair Smith, who took up the chase, had to give best on this occasion to Clark who became Champion. Liam McGill, in his luminous coloured kart, was taken on lap five by Walter Wallace who took the final step on the podium. Liam McGill took fourth just ahead of Michael Christie and Ryan McGill.

Fiona Forrest presented the trophies on behalf of GKC and Julia Mitchell presented the trophies for the ASKC in the clubhouse after the meeting.
